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We are proud to present this report to the parents and guardians of children at Ysgol Llandrillo Yn Rhos.

Schools across Wales closed on 23rd March 2020.

Pupils returned in September 2020 under new government restrictions. Classes remained in bubbles and the school day looked very different. School went into lockdown again in January 2021 when distance learning was resumed. All pupils had returned by Easter 2021.

Many children have been affected by Covid whether it be because family or friends have been unwell or because they have needed to isolate due to being contacts. The school has prioritised wellbeing for all and continues to support our pupils.

Community Links

The school is very proud of its links with the community. It works with both secondary schools and cluster primary schools on a number of initiatives.

We are fortunate to have an enthusiastic and hard working Friends of the School organisation that in normal times arranges various events during the year. The school relies on the Friends of the School to organise and help with activities to raise funds to purchase items and services that perhaps we would not normally be able to afford.

The local community and environment are usually involved in the life of the school throughout the year, with regular visits from community leaders.

We also retain strong links with organisations that hold an important place in the local community such as the Police, Fire Service etc. For instance our Police Liaison Officer, PC Gary Sinfield has visited several times in order to work with all classes in turn on aspects of Personal and Social Education (PSE) such as 'staying safe', 'social behaviour', etc.

Although we started the year with restrictions we were able to re-introduce some of our extra-curricular clubs in the summer term using outside providers.

Toilets

There are 6 main toilet blocks available across the two sites for pupils use. There are 2 staff toilet blocks and 2 disabled toilets. All toilets are cleaned daily and monitored throughout the day.

Community Links

The school has also been successfully involved in the Healthy Schools Initiative, Colwyn in Bloom Art and Gardening Competition and Eco Schools. We look forward to continuing with these very worthwhile projects.

Pupils attended day visits to Pentre. The pupils thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

The classes presented their own Christmas videos for parents and carers.
