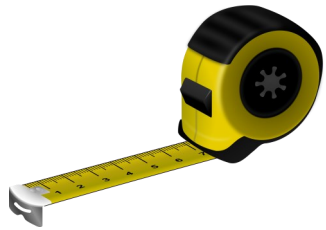

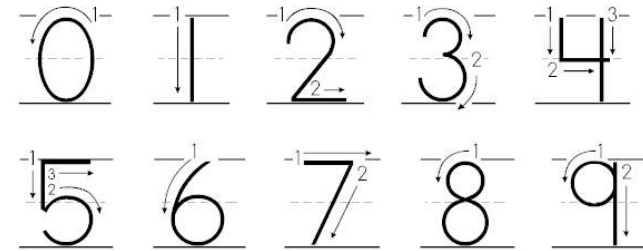
Remember to check book bags daily!
