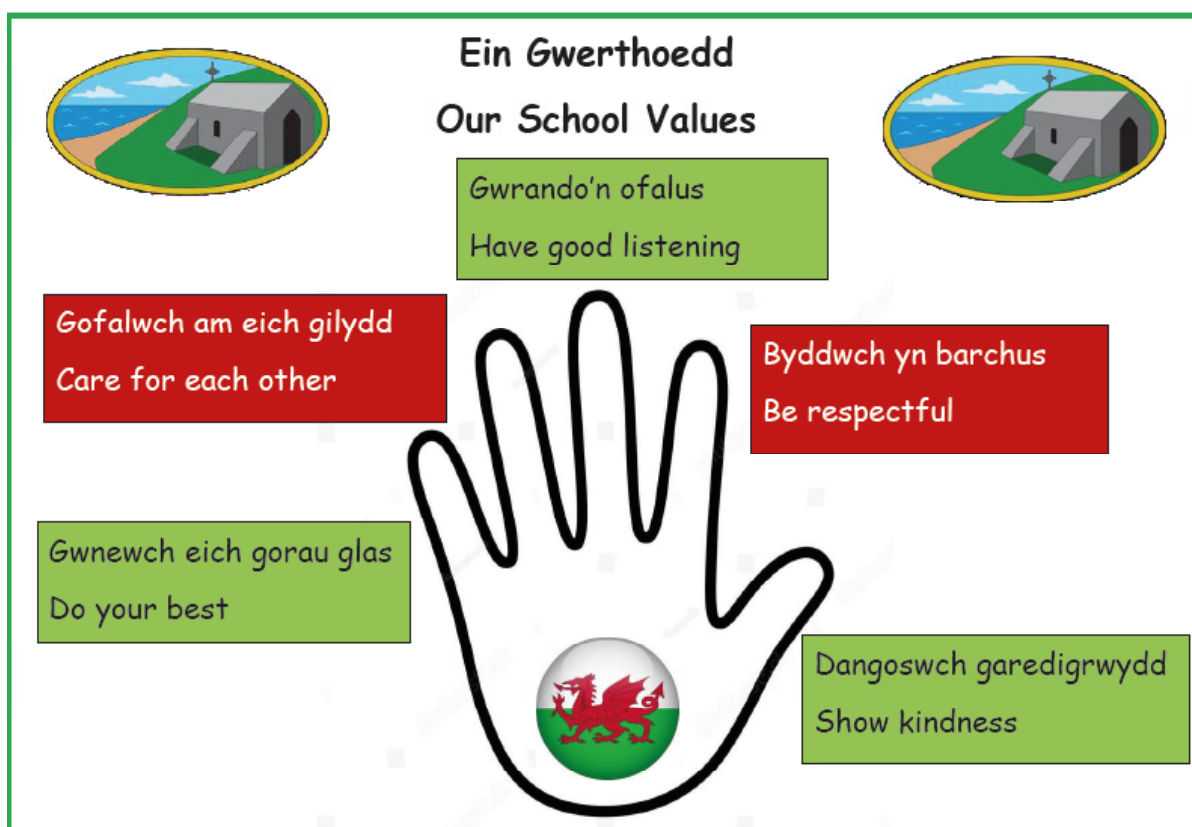
Ysgol Llandrillo yn Rhos is a mixed County Primary School which opened in 1994 when the previous infant and junior schools amalgamated.

We aim to be a place of excellent learning at the centre of the community, promoting high expectations and a love of learning by offering a wide range of opportunities to develop pupils' physical, emotional and social skills whilst equipping them with the knowledge, understanding and talents for the world in which we live.

Our staff build caring and respectful relationships, forming the foundation for a happy and successful school experience.

We have five values that help our pupils to be the best they can be:



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Admissions

Pupils begin their education with us at beginning of the school year when the child has their 4th birthday on or before 31st August of that year as per Conwy Borough Council's LA Admissions Procedures

Nursery Education

A child will be admitted to a maintained nursery school in the September following their 3rd birthday as per LA Procedures. The provision is 5 x 2.5 hour sessions per week.

Our Learning Environment

Ysgol Llandrillo admits between the ages 4 years (Reception) and 11 years (Year 6). We also provide a part-time Nursery for children in the September following their 3rd birthday.

Lessons are predominantly taught in English but, in line with the Welsh ministers mission to reach 1 million Welsh Speakers by 2050, 10% of the school day is taught through the medium of Welsh. Pupils whose home language is English study Welsh as a second language.

We currently have two buildings - one which accommodates the infant children and another for the juniors. However, all children have access to both and are lucky enough to be able to use the facilities on both sites. The premises are well maintained, with plenty of space. The junior building has nine large classrooms and the infant building has seven.

We have two halls which serve as a gym and dining area and we have two playing fields at the front of each building.

Pupils also enjoy a range of learning experiences in our garden/wildlife areas. Throughout the year every year group enjoys Forest School and 'Successful Futures' sessions.

We also have a community hub catering for the wider community.

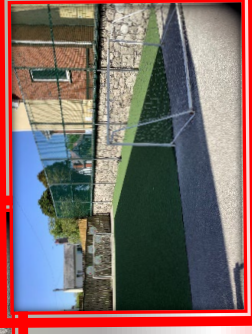

Curriculum for Wales

The majority of children begin their Curriculum for Wales learning journey between the age of 3 and 4, in our Nursery class. A further application must be made to continue their journey into Reception class and beyond, as they become statutory school age the year they turn 5. Children who are admitted between the age of 3 and 4 come into Infants and enter our Nursery class. Those admitted between the age of 4 and 5 come into Infants and enter our Reception Class.

We are incredibly proud of our approach to Early Years Education and we aim to develop your child both academically and socially. Children's love of play and their individual interests will help them achieve and will stimulate their enthusiasm for learning. We believe we offer the very best opportunities for any child to begin their education. We deliver a curriculum that is fully in line with the Foundation Phase.

Our Infants' teaching staff are appropriately qualified and experienced to work with very young children and have extensive experience of providing the right curriculum for this crucial stage of education. We also have Teaching Assistants and Higher level Teaching Assistants with wide experience of working with young children.

It is during Infants that the main building blocks of learning experiences are laid.

At Juniors children also learn many of the skills which will ensure they develop as caring members of our school community.

Teachers in all stages work as a whole staff on learning and teaching developments, ensuring shared ethos and consistency of practice. This allows our children to continually extend their learning across all areas of curriculum.

Transition between the stages within our school provides children with a feeling of security and knowledge of their surroundings. We also work hard to establish good pre-school links and to prepare our oldest children for their transition to secondary school.

During the summer junior children have the opportunity to take part in a Careers Fair where they can talk to a range of adults who represent many different career paths.

We also arrange 'Stay and Play' sessions for parents to take part in with their children in order to gain a further understanding as to how they can support their child with skills such as oracy, reading, numeracy and ICT.

Monitoring and Assessment

Assessment forms an essential part of our curriculum to ensure that children are given opportunities to achieve and celebrate their work.

Children are assessed on entering our school to determine their level of learning and identify any specific needs. From then on, their progress is tracked and monitored on a regular basis using a computerised system to record results. Targets are set to address each child's progress and to improve the quality of their education.

Reading and spelling tests are conducted twice a year from Year 2 onwards. Continuous teacher assessments are used to track children and their progress.

The National Reading, Procedural Maths and Reasoning Tests are carried out during the academic year in Years 2 - 6 as per guidance from the Welsh Assembly.

Teacher assessments are carried out regularly throughout the child's learning journey. Relevant information regarding pupil progress is shared with parents and used to support transition to the next class. The relevant results for Year 6 pupils are transferred to their secondary school. Targets are discussed with pupils and shared with parents during parent evenings and core reports.

Written reports are sent to parents at the end of each term and parent meetings are held during the Autumn, Spring and Summer Terms. We welcome parents contacting the school at any time if they have any questions or concerns.

Pupil Voice

We take a whole school approach to Pupil Voice. This means listening to the voices of our children. By involving them in decision making they make valued contributions and have a sense of ownership of the school. We provide many opportunities for children to share their views through the School Council, Eco Committee, Criw Cymraeg, Digital Leaders, Playground Buddies and reporting back to Governors.

School Council

We have two school councils, one on the infant site and one on the junior site. Both meet regularly and give children a voice in our school, encouraging confidence, promoting responsibility and introducing the principles of democracy.

Eco Committee

Our Eco Committee plays a very active part in the life of the school, organising recycling and litter picking, energy conservation and also charity events demonstrating our awareness of global citizenship.

A vast majority of our junior age children sign up for green ranger duties. We have maintained our Eco status since 2003 and have received an 'Outstanding Award'. We are also very proud that we are a Platinum Eco School.

Criw Cymraeg

We have a Criw Cymraeg consisting of pupils from both the infants and juniors. They play an active role in promoting the Welsh language and they present to the whole school each week during our celebration assembly; sharing the 'Brawddeg yr wythnos/phrase of the week' and making suggestions for Welsh playground games to play as well as rewarding pupils in each class for using their Welsh language skills. We are pleased to have achieved the Cymraeg Campus Am gwobr arian in Summer 2025.

Additional Learning Needs

Mrs Timperley is our ALNCO Leader who is responsible for supporting our children who require resources or support additional to those which are usually provided within school. We adhere to the aims and objectives suggested in the 'Additional Learning needs (Wales) Act 2018' and the Additional learning needs code 2021 and also the guidelines issued by the LA.

The School works towards early identification of children with special educational needs, through a series of measures including classroom observation, close monitoring and discussion between parents and members of staff concerned, to ensure appropriate provision.

From the earliest stages, parents are consulted and actively encouraged to participate. Additional needs provision may take the form of individual advice to the child, parents, staff and classroom assistants. Alternatively children may work in small groups either within the classroom environment or in other learning areas around the school. Some children also have extra sessions with appropriately qualified staff. These sessions help with the education of our children and also ensure that they reach their full potential.

Where appropriate we work with agencies such as the Speech and Language Support Service, Occupational Therapists, physiotherapists and educational Psychologists. Staff, parents and the relevant outside agencies then work together to ensure that the child's individual needs are met. We aim to work with families to ensure that a child's needs are catered for, be this for a short term intervention, or longer term support.

WHAT ESTYN SAYS ABOUT US

Tailored support ensures that all learners, including those with additional needs, make meaningful progress and feel supported.

Disabled pupils are welcomed to Llandrillo-yn-Rhos with encouragement and support to take part in all school activities and will not be treated less favourably than other pupils. We have developed an Accessibility Plan where we try to give consideration to all aspects of accessibility, including those with learning difficulties, physical disabilities and emotional or behavioural difficulties where we can. A copy is available on request.

More Able and Talented

Our curriculum is differentiated to allow all our children to progress. Our higher achieving pupils are stretched and challenged across all subjects and opportunities are provided to take part in additional sessions.

Behaviour

At Llandrillo yn Rhos we pride ourselves on the fantastic behaviour of the children. We follow consistent approaches to behaviour management and ensure that all children are treated equally.

We follow a restorative approach with children, understanding the consequences of their actions on themselves and others.

We praise children for working and behaving well and address less desirable behaviour quickly, using it as a learning strategy for the child.

We believe that all children should be treated as individuals.

We keep parents informed about behaviour and believe that working together is key.

Safeguarding

Safety of children is our number one priority, from security of the site to the welfare of each individual. We have very clear guidelines in place to ensure our safeguarding is robust. We ensure that all staff, volunteers and visitors have current DBS checks before working with children.

- The welfare of children, and their wishes and feelings are afforded consideration when developing and carrying out school activities.
- All children have equal rights to support and protection irrespective of their race, age, ability, gender, language, religion, sexual orientation and culture.
- All staff and volunteers have a professional role to identify and respond to the needs of children and report any concerns

We hold regular fire drills and the school is protected by an intruder alarm and we have CCTV around the school building. All external doors have coded security locks.

Health and Safety

The Headteacher is the school's Health and Safety Officer. Most of our staff hold First Aid at qualifications and a number have completed the enhanced first aid training course.

It is obviously important that the school knows of any illnesses, allergies or conditions which may have an affect on your child's health. It is important that we are kept up-to-date with any changes of address and phone numbers so that we can contact you in an emergency.

A Challenging and enjoyable Curriculum for Wales

Ysgol Llandrillo yn Rhos aims to provide an inclusive, broad, balanced and challenging curriculum that nurtures the needs of each pupil. Pupil voice is paramount. The curriculum provides each pupil with an education to be able to develop into independent learners relevant to the modern world.

Our planning encompasses the four purposes of the curriculum. These aims are to help children to be:

Ambitious and capable learners, who believe in themselves and their abilities, with the skills to learn.

Enterprising and creative contributions who can think of new ideas and solve problems.

Ethical, informed citizens who understand their rights and responsibilities, as part of their community and the wider world.

Healthy and confident individuals with healthy minds and bodies.

We endeavour to nurture and promote the Welsh language in the school using bilingual signs and the use of incidental Welsh within the school.

We have a thriving 'Criw Cymraeg' and increasing numbers and successes of children entering the various Eisteddfodau competitions.

The curriculum has six 'Areas of Learning and Experience' (AoLE):

- Expressive Arts (art, music drama and film with digital media)
- Health and Wellbeing (personal and social education, health eating and physical education)
- Humanities (history, geography and religious education)
- Language, Literacy and Communication (English, Welsh and Modern Foreign Languages)
- Mathematics and Numeracy
- Science and Technology (science, computer science and design and technology).

We plan our curriculum in line with these 'Areas of Learning and Experience'.

Our Curriculum Vision

Our curriculum policies set expectations for learning and attainment, promote continuity and progression and provide a common basis for understanding among children, staff, parents and governors.

Our curriculum is responsive to the needs of our children and changes in society and through constant monitoring, we ensure that it is broad, balanced, relevant, inclusive and well-planned.

Our Local Community

Parental and community involvement in the process of education is actively encouraged. No particular skill is necessary, just enthusiasm and readiness to help out!

Ysgol Llandrillo yn Rhos is one of 5 primary schools in the Eirias cluster. All of the schools within the cluster work together on shared priorities for improvement and the schools support each other in events are held to ensure a smooth transition for our Year 6 pupils.

We have created an effective transition package for the children moving from year 6 to year 7 and this package of activities begins when children start year 5; this ensures a smooth transition for all.

Invitations are extended to the community where celebratory events are held, such as class assemblies, Harvest Festival, the Christmas Concert and St David's Day etc.

Forest School is always a very popular activity for pupils at Ysgol Llandrillo-Yn-Rhos.

We are lucky enough to have our own specially designed area on the junior site, complete with trees, plenty of natural materials to build, a fire circle under a canopy, wooden classroom, mud kitchen, boat and wild flower borders. This is where all Forest School sessions take place.

All children at the school from Reception to Year 6 will have Forest School sessions on a rota basis, two to three times during each school year so that the children are able to experience different flora and fauna throughout the seasons.

Children visit Forest School in smaller groups, generally half of the class at a time, to ensure they can enjoy the space.

Pupils engage in huge range of activities including roasting marshmallows around the fire, building dens and creating art from natural materials. The children love role play and pretending to be woodland fairies or pirates.

The child-centred approach of Forest School supports play, exploration and supported risk taking and develops confidence and self-esteem. Hands-on experiences in a natural setting offer opportunities for holistic growth and teamwork.

If your child is scheduled to have a session at Forest School – they will need to wear old clothes that can get dirty. It is important to ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weathers, as we are out in almost all weather. If it is cold and rainy, something warm and waterproof and a hat and gloves are required. They will also need walking boots, old trainers or a pair of wellies and ideally wear long trousers and long sleeves.

If it is sunny, sun-cream will need to be applied before school to ensure they are protected.

Attendance

Regular attendance is essential if your child's progress is to be maintained. Parents, schools and the Local Authority share legal responsibilities in respect of attendance.

Should your child be absent at any time, please phone in on the first morning of absence and send an explanatory note on your child's return to school.

For dental/medical appointment please inform the school by letter and arrange to collect your child from school.

Partnerships with Parents

We actively encourage parents to support the children's learning at home. Homework is set weekly and we ask that children read at home for at least 5 minutes every day.

We have a hugely successful Friends of the school (FOTS) group who raise much needed additional funds for the school. All parents are invited to join the FOTS; no particular skill is necessary, just a willing pair of hands and some good ideas!

- Ensure that your child attends school punctually every day during term time, unless there is a good reason for absence (e.g. illness).
- Notify the school by email or telephone in the event of absence.
- To support the school behaviour expectations, values, friendship, teamwork, perseverance, honesty, respect and responsibility.

Complaints Procedure

Although we strive to maintain a happy, open-door ethos, regrettably complaints do sometimes arise.

Should you have a complaint your first port of call should be the class teacher. However the Head or Deputy Headteacher are available for more formal complaints.
